Alan G. Lisle,

87, of Indianapolis, passed away April 2, 2021. He was born October 22, 1933 in Peoria, IL to the late Alan Grant Sr. and Edith (Studer) Lisle. Alan graduated from Peoria's Woodruff High School, received his BA from Bradley University and Master's Degrees from University of Southern California and Ball State. He served 21 years in the U.S. Air Force with multiple assignments including the Azores, Turkey and Vietnam. He retired as a Major in 1976, and subsequently worked in PR/Development at Ivy Tech, Marian College and the Scottish Rite Foundation. He was a 33^o of the Scottish Rite, a member of Masonic Lodge #717, The Service Club, American Legion, Indianapolis Public Relations Society, and served as a Colonel in the Indiana Chapter of the Air Force Association.
