Another memory I have is the day we decided to pull all the wild onions from the grassy patches in the playground area and eat them. We both became ill and got in trouble!

Although I have not seen or spoken to Allen in years he weighed heavy on my heart yesterday; I began looking on Facebook for him with no avail. This morning I happened to be reading the obituaries and my heart sunk as tears rolled down my face. It pains me to find out I was a day late in finding out of his passing and funeral. I would have loved to be there to honor my friend!

I have a favor to ask, I want to do something in Allen's honor, such as volunteer a day at his church or just something. I would love to get together and learn more about him as an adult. I am sure he was as AMAZING as he was a true friend in school.
