Barbara Fox Schmidlin, Indianapolis was born September 15, 1939 in Loda, IL, and passed away November 24, 2015. Barbara over the years, entertained as a “top forties” singer under the name “Barbara Fox”, appearing at many of Indy’s night clubs, Columbia Club and Athletic Clubs. Barbara also appeared in Florida in the Tampa/St. Pete area. She was also active in the Footlight Musical theatrical group and starred in productions of Finnegans Rainbow and Pajama Game. In recent years she continued her entertaining at many of the local retirement and nursing homes singing and dancing along with her husband, Ed, helping residents recall memories of the past.

Visitation will be Sunday, November 29, 2015 from 2:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m. and Monday, November 30, 2015 from 10:00 a.m. until the time of the service at 1:00 p.m. at Shirley Brothers Fishers-Castleton Chapel, 9900 Allisonville Road, Fishers IN.
