




Byeong Keun Ha

January 8, 1966 - November 18, 2012

Dr. Byeong Keun Ha was born on January 8, 1966 in Busan, South Korea. He had contracted Tuberculosis as a child, and did not receive proper treatment, causing numerous health problems that troubled him his whole life. The unbearable pain and suffering he endured motivated him to become a medical doctor in hopes of curing his disease not only for himself but also for others who suffer from similar conditions. After graduating from Seoul National University College of Medicine in 1990, Dr. Ha came to the United States to earn a doctorate in Neuroscience at Ohio State University. After completing his Ph.D. in 1999, he remained as a post-doctoral fellow and research associate in the same program. During this time, he compiled several theories on the therapeutic qualities of Vitamin C and NAC (N-Acetyl Cysteine) into several books written in Korean, all of which support his belief that Vitamin C could be used to help patients suffering from chronic symptoms brought about by cancer and other diseases. In 2010, Dr. Ha and his family moved to Indiana to become an assistant professor and associate director of Transfusion Medicine and Cellular Therapy at Indiana University School of Medicine, Indianapolis, Indiana. He was a faithful member and deacon of the Korean Presbyterian Church of Indianapolis. His passion for God was seen in his worship and singing; his voice loud and clear despite the fact that he had to breathe with the help of supplemental oxygen. This inspiring story of his life-long battle with disease, his compassionate heart for patients, and his strong belief in the future uses of Vitamin C will be a model for future
