Charles H. Seefeldt, Charles Seefeldt, 91, passed peacefully on the afternoon of May 28th, 2007, Memorial Day, at St. Vincent's Hospice in Indianapolis, IN. He graduated from Wausau High School and the University of Wisconsin, Madison. He was an Army Air Corp veteran of World War II, honorably discharged as a Captain. After the war, he became a senior buyer for Sears Roebuck in Chicago and retired to Bradenton, FL in 1972. Due to health reasons, Charles and his wife, June, relocated to Indianapolis, IN near their son in 2006. Throughout his life, Charles was a musician [clarinet] and played with many local organizations in the Chicago area and Sarasota including the Sarasota Concert Orchestra and the Sarasota Concert Band where he also served as president. He also enjoyed Bridge, Scrabble, fishing, hunting, tennis, bicycling, woodworking and construction. He is registered in the U.S. Patent Office for a typewriter patent and with the Library of Congress as co-author of a book under the pseudonym of Chuck Lakefield called Bridge and Gin Gambitry. He is a member of the Bethel Baptist Church of Bradenton and was a member of the Methodist Church of Riverside. He heroically saved the life of a neighbor.
