“ Connie sponsored our grand daughters from Little Flower, the Williamsons, for Summer camp attendance. In response, I wrote and mailed a 'thank you' note to her. She called me to compliment and thank me because, in her words, "it is a first, from a grandfather and hand written!" She then stated she wanted to meet us, my wife and I, so we made arrangements to attend a 5:00 P.M. Saturday mass to do so. From there we began to meet for breakfasts at the Steer-In, one after the other as well as lunches of catfish on Sherman Drive, a mutually desired meal for consumption. During the course of many conversations, I came to know that Connie always 'called it as she saw it in no uncertain terms, a reaper, separating wheat from chaff and yet fully aware of the fact this was not always what others would tolerate. We also stumbled on a similar interest regarding the refurbishment of the statues in the church. As friends, we agreed to tackle the matter and our conversations from that point became one of planning an acceptable approach to the parish.

As a result, we held several (rehearsed) meetings with Father Bob; rehearsed because Connie realized she needed a 'filter' and someone to keep her 'calm'. She often said to me that I was that person. You can see the results of Connie's patience and persistence she mustered up and you can remember her each time you look at the statues of the Virgin Mary, Saint Anthony, Saint Joseph, Saint Teresa and the Sacred Heart.

I admired her, loved her and believe she was beatified in life before death. Over the past year and more we only conversed by telephone. In our last call, a day or two before the accident, she again expressed her deep desire to return to her routine of attending the 5:00 P.M. Mass followed by her scheduled time in the Chapel. I will miss her!

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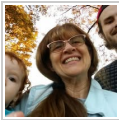
