Donald Eugene Lang, 90, of Greenwood, formerly of Indianapolis passed away peacefully December 8, 2025. He was born October 6, 1935 in Beech Grove, Indiana to the late Joseph E., Sr. and Hilda E. (Knapp) Lang. Don was a 1953 graduate of Arsenal Technical High School. He proudly served his country in the United States Army and Air Force and married Alice Louise Moffett in 1958. His first job was with Central States Bridge & Structural Company until 1979 then he co-founded QES working his entire career as a structural steel draftsman before retiring in 2001.

Don was a longtime member of Old Bethel United Methodist Church. He was also a member and past President of the Irvington and Lawrence Kiwanis, and a member and past Treasurer of Indy Disc Dog Club. In his spare time, he was a volunteer at Riley Hospital for Children, Indianapolis Animal Care Services and Old Bethel Food Pantry. After moving to Bickford Assisted Living, Don became their "Resident Counsel Moderator". Throughout Don's life, he never came across a person he considered to be a stranger. He was always the first to volunteer or help a person in need. Don was loved by many and will be missed greatly. He was addressed as, "one of the special ones."
