Doris P. Liford,

100, a lifelong resident of Indianapolis, passed away January 4, 2021. She was born December 18, 1920 in Fountain Square to the late Joseph P. and Clara Hess George. She married Marvin R. Liford and he preceded her in death, April 7, 1974.

Doris began attending Calvary Tabernacle in 1953 where she served as a Sunday school teacher, Vacation Bible School teacher, and sang in the adult choir for many years. She began driving a school bus for Calvary Christian School in 1963 and shortly thereafter began cooking in the cafeteria at CCS for many years and then for Indiana Bible College, retiring in 2014 at the age of 94.

Due to Covid-19 restrictions, the family will attend private funeral services.

Doris is survived by her loving children, Rev. Jack W. Liford (Naomi) of Arlington, TX, Jesse J. Liford (Becky) of Spencer, IN, Josephine (Daniel), Janeta and Jamie, all of Indianapolis; 18 grandchildren; several great-grandchildren and great-great-grandchildren.
