Eugene O. Maley, 87, of Indianapolis, passed away January 29, 2017. He was born December 8, 1929 in Weston, West Virginia to the late Orvil Elza and Vada Irene Beamer Maley. He proudly served his country in the U.S. Army during the Korean War. Eugene received his J.D. Degree from the Maurer School of Law at Indiana University in 1963. Over the course of his legal practice, he was a member of the Indianapolis Bar Association, Indiana State Bar Association, American Bar Association, and other Bar Associations particular to his law practice, including the Indianapolis Law Club and the Association of Defense Trial Attorneys. Eugene taught Business Law at the Kelly School of Business, IUPUI for over 40 years. Gene was a partner at Smith, Maley & Douglas. He was a member of Old Bethel United Methodist Church where he taught adult Sunday School for over 30 years and served as a Trustee; a 3rd Degree Mason at Masonic Lodge #398 Mystic Tie; Scottish Rite member; and Gideon member. During his lifetime Gene traveled to all 50 states.
