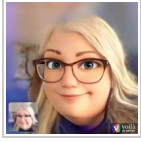

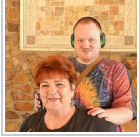

“Geron was a unique fellow that I knew for many, many years. His heart was often "too big" for this world, which would be a recurring frustration for him. Early on, I was impressed by his love and commitment to his music. He learned to play the guitar like a pro shortly after picking it up. He then quickly became adept at playing the bass guitar, drums and even keyboards. During visits, he would often share with me recordings of his most recent songs/pieces that he was working on. When I complimented him, he would often shake his head and claim that he could do it even better, even though, I heard no flaw in the recording. He also had a so much passion for his family and friends, who more often than not, meant the world to him. He was always sharing stories of how he needed to help this or that person, and I witnessed him on multiple occasions sharing money, food and his home with others in need. Geron also shared with me how he wanted to "do right for his brother" and how he loved his mother, from whom he received much guidance, support and direction. "...She's all that I have. If I lose my mom, I have nothing..." Geron impressed me with his work ethic. He kept his apartment spotless. Throughout his life, he was always looking for jobs, from mowing yards as a teen to later working in construction, retail, food services, etc. and often being the "go to person" when help was needed. On one occasion, I picked Geron up along the highway, as he was walking to work during a snow storm. I just happened to see him as I was passing by. Unlike most, he was not calling off! He often developed warm relationships with his supervisors and his coworkers. Geron was also a very "open" person, as he would frequently share with me new things that he had read, seen, heard or otherwise experienced. We would often talk about concerts and music, and even visit the local guitar shops. One time, shortly after parking at a music store, Geron said, "We have to leave. Now." When I asked him why, he shared a story about a salesperson asking him to leave sometime during the week prior for playing too loud! Geron was known to be easily absorbed in his playing, and that there was no such thing as "music too loud". I often witnessed him entertaining various persons with his stories, bringing smiles to others' faces. In his life, he

touched many and I am proud to know him as a friend.
