Gurpreet was known by few names; Gopi, Guri, and Nurse Preet. She held many roles, beloved daughter, cherished sister, and loyal friend. Our dear Gopi had energy that could lift any room. Her laughter was contagious, and she shared joy with everyone around her. She was just as quick to cry as she was to laugh. She held immense love for all her family, friends, and patients.

Gopi graduated with her B.S in Nursing in May 2025, a milestone she reached after years of dedication, perseverance, and quiet strength — all while navigating personal hardships that would have discouraged many. True to her compassionate spirit, she stepped into her dream role as a Cardiovascular ICU Nurse at Riley Children’s Hospital on August 18th, 2025. Just one week later, she was admitted to the hospital, where she remained until she ultimately left us.

Gopi underwent a difficult heart surgery — a challenge she met with the same bravery and grace that defined her life. When she learned the surgery was necessary, it was her loved ones who wept, while she was the one offering comfort. In her calm, steady voice, she told us this was for the best — that her pain would finally ease. Even in the face of fear and uncertainty, Gopi

consoled others before herself. That was the heart she carried. She never let her struggle overshadow her spirit, never letting on just how much she had endured. Her passing on September 8, 2025, came as a heartbreaking and unexpected loss — one that has left a deep void in the hearts of all who knew and loved her.
