



Harold R. "Dick" Hicks

November 28, 1937 - July 12, 2023

Harold "Dick" Hicks, 85, of Indianapolis, passed away July 12, 2023. He was born November 28, 1937 in Louisville, KY, to the late Harold Cabbage and Ruth (Tilford) Hicks. Dick was a graduate of Eastern High School, Louisville; and received his bachelor's degree in engineering from the University of Kentucky. He proudly served his country in the U.S. Army and married Norma Louise Epperson. Dick was co-owner of Hicks & Nogan Engineering Firm for many years. Dick was a longtime member of the United States Table Tennis Association, served as a board member on the Hall of Fame and Ethics Committee for the U.S. Table Tennis Association. He was also a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers; and a former member of Lyndon Baptist Church, Louisville. Dick enjoyed playing table tennis and forensic engineering work in his spare time, but most importantly he cherished time with his wife, son, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren.

Visitation will be Tuesday, July 18, 2023 from 4:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. at Shirley Brothers Washington Memorial Chapel, with funeral services there Wednesday, July 19, 2023 at 10:00 a.m.

Dick is survived by his wife, Norma Hicks; son, Rick (Kathy) Hicks; grandchildren, Ryan (Melinda) Hicks, Sean Hicks and Alyse (Jeremiah) Wilck; and great-grandchildren, Isaiah, Judah, Micah, Freya and Connor.

His service continued on the Hall of Fame Committee as a member to honor and recognize those that made a difference in the sport just like he did. I will miss our next HOF zoom meeting, but will not forget his words of wisdom he shared each time we spoke.

“ June 7, 2003

Dick and I met in the St. Charles Hotel. This was a classy well-established old-time hotel in what was then torn-up Indianapolis. Nice inside, a war zone outside.

Dick had been designing roadways for many years, knew what was going to happen at every stage of his work, and was looking for something interesting, different and challenging to do.

Our work must have sounded interesting and challenging to Dick, and he accepted my offer and decided to join us.

That was October 1, 1993. At that time we were still Smith & Robson. The Robson side of the company had a manned office in Lancaster. State College, Pittsburgh and Albany practices had one person, each operating from his home. We also had a mail type office in Cleveland. That was it. Our company, then.

Our office in Indianapolis was remote from any of our areas. It was an experiment in starting a remote office.

Dick was the first, other than Lancaster, to go in to a real office.

Dick started with Indiana. In 1994 we expanded to Kentucky, eastern Illinois and the Cincinnati area.

Later we asked Dick to look after starting a practice in Michigan.

Other offices were spawned from Indianapolis. The Michigan office became a practice. Duane Meeker left and started St. Louis. Cincinnati became part of the Ohio practice.

Today, the Indianapolis practice consists of Indiana, Kentucky and eastern Illinois, and we have several full time and a nice

complement of part time people. Dick, Malea, Lowell Pruett, Jay Nogan and Reg Smith in Kentucky.

Dick and I are both Civil Engineers, and have interests in common. We have gone to annual conferences together for many years. We have become personal friends, as well as my family and Dick's family.

I have learned about Dick's prowess in table tennis and learned a few tricks myself.

All and all, it has been both a personal and professional pleasure to know and work with Dick these past 10 years.

My only failure has been that I haven't been able to get Dick to take up bicycling. Now, he may be worried that I am going to push this one step further today and give him and Norma bicycles. I couldn't bring bicycles into Hershey Park.

But, I also couldn't bring a laptop computer into the Park.

I wrote this for a Robson Forensic company event in 2003. It still seems appropriate today. As far as I know, Dick got good use out of the laptop.

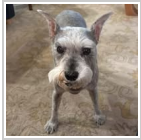

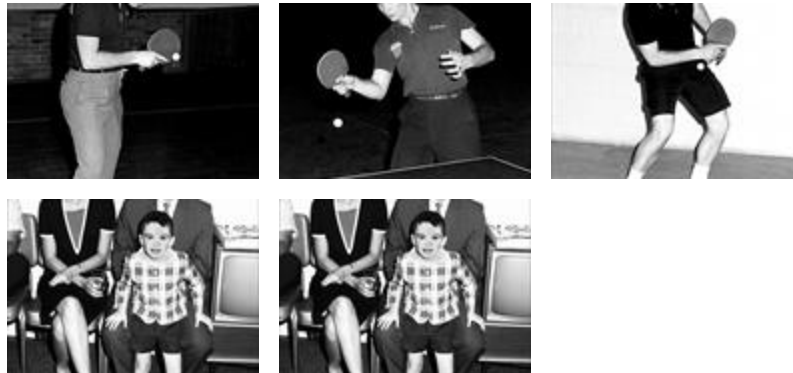
