Harry E. Ervin,

86, of Indianapolis, passed away March 12, 2016. He was born September 3, 1929 in Indianapolis, to the late Ross and Margaret Farris Ervin. He served his country during the Korean War in the U. S. Army and was employed at Eli Lilly as a clerk for 38 years, retiring in 1991.

Harry was a member of Cumberland United Methodist Church, Prospect Masonic Lodge # 714, Scottish Rite and American Legion # 374. He volunteered at the Eastside Outreach Ministry and delivered Meals on Wheels for many years.

Harry was a sanctioned umpire for the ISHA. He also umpired for College and American Legion games. In the 1960's-70's, he was a stand-in umpire for the Indianapolis Indians.
