Harry R. Stone,

“ Harry was my first supervisor at Naval Avionics, starting in 1961; the best leader I ever worked for, and there have been many.. I once had a contractor in New Jersey disagree with me about an electronic interference failure. He asked if he could call Harry. I told him okay. I'd not talked to Harry about the failure and felt a twinge of worry. Harry asked him, "What does Coy say?" Harry told him, "Then it's a failure."
In an earlier casual conversation, the guy had told me that he doesn't raise his voice when he is angry. He just sets in silence for a while.
