January 18, 1918 - April 22, 2007

Jack D. Morrow, 89, Greenwood, died Sunday, April 22, at Greenwood Village South Pavilion. Jack was born January 18, 1918, in Cincinnati, Ohio, the only child of Paul and Grace Morrow. He graduated from Lockland (Ohio) High School and Miami University where he met his wife of 65 years, Harriet Cail Morrow. Jack came to Indianapolis in 1940 to begin his 50-year broadcasting career. He spent most of those years at Radio Station WIBC. He served in various on-the-air and administrative jobs- announcer, disk jockey, news reporter, color man for basketball games, interviewer, and program director. From 1969 through 1978 he was producer of the 500 Mile Race broadcast for the Speedway Network. For several years he did the FCC licensing for the Fairbanks Broadcasting Co. radio stations. At the time of his retirement in 1990, he was the commercial operations manager and public service director of WIBC. Jack was a member of Indiana Broadcast Pioneers and their Hall of Fame. He was also a member of Old Bethel United Methodist Church and Cumberland Lodge #726 F&AM. Funeral services will be held Wednesday, April 25, at 10:00 a.m. at Shirley Brothers Washington Memorial Chapel, 9606 E. Washington St., with calling Tuesday from 4:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. Entombment will follow at Washington Park East Cemetery.
