James ♦Jim♦ McQueenie, 74, Indianapolis, died on Sept. 15, 2007. He was born in Edinburgh, Scotland, on Oct. 27, 1932. He served a two-year conscription in the R.A.F. stationed in Germany. Jim was a professional squash player and teacher of racquet sports. In 1959 he was ranked the #4 squash player in the world and remained in the top 10 for 16 years. He was athletic director at several racquet clubs in Scotland, Canada, and the United States before moving to Indianapolis in 1971 where he became the squash pro and athletic director at the Indianapolis Athletic Club. In 1992, the City of Indianapolis declared July 11 as ♦Jim McQueenie Day.♦ Jim was a professional member of the British Squash Association, the National Association of Athletic Directors, and Castleton United Methodist Church. Jim leaves behind his wife of 53 years, Jean, whom he dubbed ♦the greatest thing that ever happened in his life.♦ He also is survived by three children♦his son Douglas, (Tracy) Indianapolis, IN, daughter Linda McMahon, Savannah, GA, and son, Andrew, Indianapolis, IN; sister Jean and brother Brian both of Montreal, Canada; and grandchildren, Megan, Madison and Kennedy.
