Jeanne McGill O'Haver was a singer and founding member of the popular 1970s band Shiloh Morning. She sang in many bands over the years as well as doing jingle and back-up vocals on numerous projects. For the last 20 years she had performed contemporary Christian music with her husband and singing partner Greg O'Haver in their band CROSSOVERroad. Jeanne played percussion, sang both lead and harmony vocals and had that rare ability to connect with people through her songs on a very personal and inspiring level. For the last eleven years, she had been fighting cancer, but it didn't quiet her voice or her heart. She continued to share her faith and encourage fellow cancer patients and others to fight through whatever obstacles might be in their way.
