Jeffrey C. Paulson, 78, of Noblesville, passed away March 16, 2022. He was born September 26, 1943 in Gary, Indiana to the late Michael C. Paulson and Estelle Kwiatkowski Paulson. Jeffrey was a graduate of Lew Wallace High School. He earned his Bachelor's Degree from Purdue University and his Master's Degree from National Lewis University.
