Joseph H. Eisenhut, 83, of Indianapolis, passed away May 29, 2024 after a lengthy illness. He was born March 9, 1941 in Indianapolis, Indiana to the late Robert and Dorothy M. Weber Eisenhut. Joe was a proud graduate of Cathedral High School, Class of 1959, and received his Master of Science degree in Music Education from Butler University. While attending Butler he was very active in the University Bands where he displayed his talent on the trumpet. Upon graduation, he was a dedicated teacher, co-worker, Senior Class Advisor, and beloved Band Director for many years at Morristown High School. He developed pride among his students, resulting in a program which produced an award winning band. These memories continue to carry forth throughout the lives of those he touched.

Following his teaching career, Joe became an owner/landlord of multiple rental properties on the Indianapolis Eastside. He played lead trumpet with "The Continentals" dance band that performed for various special events throughout central Indiana, including featured solos on a 1970s release of their vinyl album. Among other joys, Joe relished many summer excursions to his lake lot, was an avid football fan, and was a loving brother and friend to many.

Joseph is survived by his sisters, Donna Mae Ozburn and Penny Eisenhut;

former wife, Judy Eisenhut; long-time friend, Carol (Pierson) McAdams; and several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his brothers, Richard J. Eisenhut and James W. Eisenhut; and sister, Marianne Eisenhut.

Visitation will be held Thursday, June 6, 2024 from 10:00 a.m. until the time of Mass at 11:00 a.m. at Holy Spirit Catholic Church, 7243 East 10th Street, Indianapolis. Burial will follow at Calvary Cemetery.
