Joseph G. Mattingly,

93, of Indianapolis, passed away February 6, 2021. He was born September 24, 1927 to the late Adrian J. and Mabel L. Mattingly. Joe was a graduate of Arsenal Tech High School, and attended Butler University. He married Mary C. Gannon, October 5, 1946, and was a Tool & Die maker for Western Electric for 15 years. After retiring from Western Electric, he was the owner/operator of the Hideaway Tavern and Ravenswood Package Liquor for 22 years. Joe was a longtime member of Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church. Joe was a member of the Ancient Order of Hibernians, the Knights of Columbus and the Moose Lodge. He was also a volunteer football coach for Cathedral High School for many years.
