Joyce L. Webb, 92, died at home following a brief illness.

Born in 1933 to Ivah Blackburn Myers and Lindsey R. Myers, Joyce spent her early years in Montezuma, IN before the family moved to Indianapolis. Joyce graduated from Thomas Carr Howe High School with the Class of 1951. Upon graduation, Joyce joined the law firm of Kightlinger & Gray as legal secretary to Erle Kightlinger, the firm's founder and a former president of the Indianapolis Public Schools Board of Commissioners.

Joyce was married to Jerry Webb for 58 years until his death in 2010. When their children were young, Joyce worked as a production typist for the Christian Church, Disciples of Christ Board of Church Extension ("Mission's Building") to be within walking distance of her children's school and their Irvington home. As her children grew, she returned to work as a legal secretary with Bose McKinney & Evans where she was proud to have supported notable legal professionals, including Senior United States District Court Judge, Sarah Evans Barker, and the late Ronald Elberger.

Joyce loved to dance. From childhood into her 80s, she enjoyed being part of tap and jazz classes. An accomplished quilter of both patchwork and applique, Joyce had a gift for making unique, eye-catching designs. Her beautiful crewel embroidery pictures grace the walls of her home. Her family is grateful to have these treasures as reminders of her creativity and the joy she received from making beautiful works of art.

Joyce was predeceased by her parents Ivah and Lindsey Myers; husband Jerry Webb; and brother Larry A. Myers. She is survived by her son Randy Webb; daughter-in-law Carla; and daughter Kimalie Webb.
