Katharine Pantzer Lange,

Passed away on September 5, 2025, she was 71 years old. Katharine was born on April 9, 1954. The second daughter of Kurt Pantzer Jr. and Elizabeth (Kennedy) Elliott. She was a graduate of Tudor Hall in 1972, Ithaca College with a Bachelor's in Fine Arts in 1976, and a Masters in Art Administration from American University in 1980. Katharine leaves behind her siblings, Elizabeth (Lisa) Pantzer, Kurt Pantzer III, and Julia (Frederick) Hess.

The arts were her passion. She worked at Arena Stage in Washington, D.C. and at Civic Theatre in Indianapolis. She was a regular performer in plays with the Dramatic Club and Civic Theatre. She also regularly co-directed productions of *The Secret Garden* as part of Orchard in Bloom.

Katharine left an impression on everyone she met. Whether longtime friends or choice encounters, people were surprised – and often caught off guard – by her witty comments and quick repartee. Often at the heart of boisterous conversation, Katharine brought out giggles and guffaws from everyone she met.

But above all, Katharine was most proud of her role raising two boys, Brendy (Anne Schutte Lange) and Eric (Anne Reed Lange). She was champion and cheerleader for their accomplishments on the sports field, in the classroom, and in life. As her boys created families of their own, her six grandchildren came to love her spunk, creativity, and joy with their grandmother. They inherited Katharine's love of the arts and continue her legacy: on their own

they write, direct, and perform original plays to perform at every family gathering.

“ I have been so wistful since learning of the passing of My Dear KPPR [Katharine Pantzer, Public Relations].

I haven't the words to describe the tide of feelings and memories that have come up at the news of her passing. As things happen, we both had long-term health issues, and I allowed mine to discombobulate my communications, as it seemed all I had to share was my frustration with my situation, and no one wants to hear that.

I met Katharine on May 15, 1978, when I became a member of the Public Relations team at Arena Stage in Washington, D.C. She was my anchor in a fast-moving, ever changing office atmosphere.

I loved Katharine immediately. She helped me in so many ways — she had organizational habits that I copied and use to this day, she guided me in the right clothes to wear for Opening Nights and Special Events, helped me remember the names of Board Members, donors, directors, actors, and other important theater personages. We had a small group of folks who would meet for breakfast (and getting theater folk up for breakfast before work is a wonder), lunch, or dinner, and visit for activities outside of work. Her sister Julie worked at Arena for a bit, and brother Kurt worked in D.C. for a while, and we'd meet at the hotel dining room on Thomas Circle for Happy Hour and dinner. Oh, my golly, I can taste the onion rings that came in a bread pan now.

I was so excited for Katharine when she got engaged and then moved on to marriage and motherhood, seeing her two sons grow up tall and handsome and then into marriages and parenthood of their own. Katharine's joy in them beamed through our letters, cards, emails, phone calls, Facebooks.
