Kenton Ray Bell,

50, of Jacksonville, FL, formerly of Indianapolis, passed away December 8, 2015. He was born in Fort Belvoir, VA, on February 14, 1965 to MSG Everett M. and Bobbie Jean Yates Bell. Kent was a graduate of Thomas Carr Howe High School. He attended the University of Kentucky, IUPUI, Ball State University and UNF as a Statistician, known as Scorekeeper Extraordinaire. Kent was a published author of "Look Ma, No Hands, No Legs either" and his life story won an Emmy for Best Story of the Year. He was an avid sports fan, and advocate and activist for independent living for those with disabilities. He was profiled in national television and print media and had appeared on the Oprah Winfrey Show. He was awarded the Florida Governor's award, and had previously been the host of an internet radio program on Advocate 4 Success. Kent departed this life and entered into Heaven on December 8, 2015 in Jacksonville, FL, having waged a heroic lifelong defiance of seemingly insurmountable odds.

Visitation will be Thursday, December 17, 2015 from 11:00 a.m. until the time of service at 1:00 p.m. at Shirley Brothers Washington Memorial Chapel, 9606 E. Washington St.

“Kenton Ray Bell, 50, of Jacksonville, Fla., departed this life and entered into Heaven on Tuesday, Dec. 8, 2015, having waged a heroic lifelong defiance of seemingly insurmountable odds. He passed away at Memorial Hospital in Jacksonville.

Kent was born Feb. 14, 1965, at Fort Belvoir, Va.

Survivors include his mother, Mrs. Bobbie Jean Chestnut (Yates) and stepfather, Rev. John Paul Chestnut of Kingsland; brothers, Victor G. Bell and wife (Mary) of Oaklandon, Ind., Maj. Daniel A. Allison Memorial Chapel and Funeral Home of St. Marys. Georgia is in charge of arrangements.

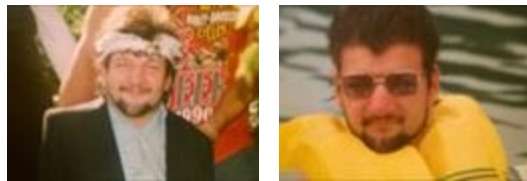
