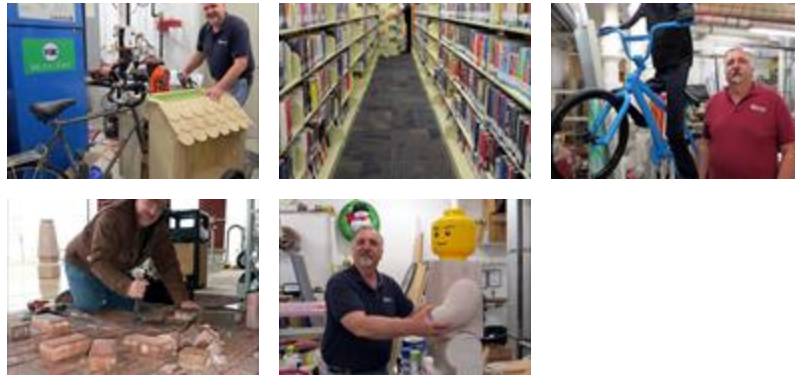

On a lighter note, it was not fun when we were dining out at Joe's Crab Shack and we all learned shortly afterward that Kevin was allergic to shellfish. And when he and Lynne were moving out of their Greenfield home, we bought some of his tools and saws that he no longer wanted. He gave us a very good price plus gave me a ceramic kiln. We will always cherish those tools and think of him when we use them. And years ago when Lynne and I were into collecting antique pottery, Kevin knew what I liked and bought me a little ceramic majolica leaf and a lid for a sugar bowl that needed a lid. I will also cherish those things. That was the kind of special man he was. He was a wonderful father, husband, friend, and human being. Sleep well gentle giant.
