He proudly served his country as a pilot for 23 years flying C-130 planes in the U.S. Air Force, after being honorably discharged he received his master's degree in finance from the University of Toledo. Ken married Carolyn Joyce Sommer, May 20, 1972 and was employed in the Trust Department for Key Bank for over 29 years, retiring in 2011. He was a former member of Lambertville United Methodist Church, Lambertville, Michigan and a current member of Castleton United Methodist Church, the VFW, and the American Legion Post #514.
