She then taught music at St. Joan of Arc School and was the Music Director at St. Joan of Arc Catholic Church, St. Elizabeth Seton Catholic Church, St. Mary Catholic Church and finally as Assistant Music Director for Ss. Peter and Paul Cathedral. Mary Martha was felt blessed to be able to use the gift that God gave her which was music. She offered her music as a return gift to God from God's gift to her. She prayed that her music blessed others as well.

Mary Martha wishes to acknowledge her greatest friend and soulmate, Father Leo Piguet. I had a phone call one afternoon from Mary Martha (btw, she was always Mary Martha and not just Mary) several years ago to tell me good-bye - the nuns had just performed a blanket ceremony which means you will die very soon. Well, she didn’t die and a few weeks later she called me from her home. A new medical protocol saved her life in the nick of time.

Mary went right back to making beautiful music and working very hard to do so. I know all the choirs she directed and parishioners who listened loved her talent.

I’ve known Mary Martha since I was 3 years old. We were in the same Sunday School classes at the Baptist Temple. From that point we both were in the same grade, many of the same classes in elementary, then junior high school and on through our high school graduation.
