I did know Kaye for a lifetime. Grew up across the street from her and was best friends with her sis, Linda, who we lost last year. Ever since Kaye's husband died, I visited her often, I was grieving for my youngest son's paralysis and she was grieving for Aaron. We comforted each other often over weekends of eating out, drinking wine, and watching movies almost all night. After Linda passed away in April, 2021, she lost what little remained of her interest in living. At the same time, the doctor discovered she had melanoma and I spent several hours at the hospital during her surgeries. I tried to get her to move over here (Cincinnati) so I could care for her; but she wouldn't leave her house or her cats, so I continued making trips to Indianapolis to help her and grieve with her for Linda. I wish I could have been with her during the last weeks of her life, but I will just have to console myself with the knowledge that I helped her through all her surgeries and most of her doctor appointments and kept in close touch until I married on April 23rd lol f this year. Kaye - you will leave a HUGE hole in my life and I will miss you so much; but I know you are finally at peace with God and the people you loved.
