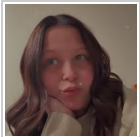

*He also loved fishing. I like to imagine him now in perfect peace, free from pain and surrounded by the beauty of God's creation. That thought brings me comfort.*

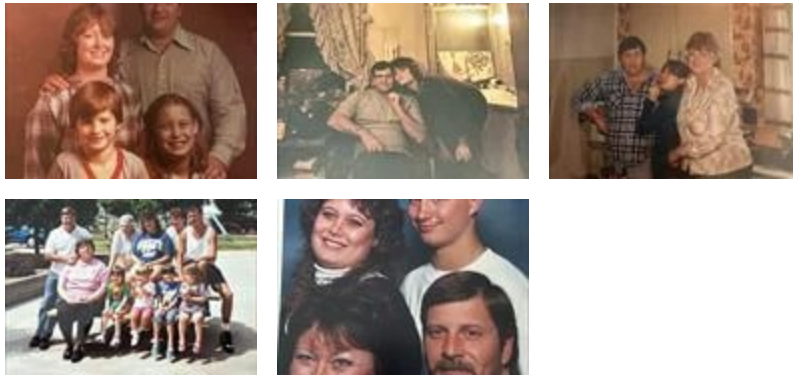
*Daddy, thank you for being there for me. Thank you for always being my constant! Thank you for your love, your sacrifices and your guidance.*
