She remarks how much her mom lit up under Ray's care. How much she smiled and laughed. Something healing happened in the family as the love was shown.

Ray's poor health didn't keep Ray from dreaming about all that they would do together. He had big plans. He didn't live in a depression, but lived with a hope of someday getting a heart transplant. Though Ray had a physically bad heart, he had a great big and wonderfully loving heart of gold. He wanted to melt a family together out of various pieces and make it one great loving family. He loved Desiree's kids Lauren, Devon, and Michael. That love began to melt that family together. Michael would pray for his stepdad. He did not want to lose him. A lot was happening in the heart of this family. I think it had a lot to do with what was happening in Ray's heart. Raised a good Methodist boy, Ray continued desiring a relationship with Jesus. He worshiped at Northview and Radiant Life, but when He met Desiree, they wanted to grow in Jesus together in a church family that fit both of them. They found our church. I remember their first day with us. I remember thinking what a tall couple! We had just opened this campus and they were invited to come by their friends the O'Keef family. Well, they just kept coming. The more they were here, the more the Word of God caused them to come to life and connect to grow. In fact, Ray thanked Desiree for showing him that God was not just a cosmic God above it all, but even more, a personal God who could be talked to. Ray began to do just that. He prayed more. Ray had a brother that passed years ago and they were quite a pair. 23 months apart, Lloyd and Ray, were something else. They were known in the family as Chip and Skip. Ray was Skip. I have to say that you see because some people here have almost never heard Skip called Ray. Once a person came to Ray’s place of employment of 30 years, HH Gregg, and was asking to see Skip. The other employees had no idea who the person was talking about. “I’m looking for Skip. He works here. Skip Secret.” Just then, Ray walked by. And the person said, “Him! Skip!”

Well Skip, was an animal lover. His mother was always ending up with animals she didn’t want, but because he was a boy scout apparently, he’d be allowed to keep them. He was smooth though.
