Age 89, of Fishers, Indiana passed away April 27, 2020. He was born April 17, 1931 in Irondale, Alabama to the late Reynolds and Thelma Saddler (Peck).

Dick proudly served his country in the U.S. Army for over 44 years, rising through the enlisted ranks to become the most senior Master Warrant Officer (4), as an Army Bandmaster.

Dick enjoyed performing, playing and composing music and was known for his unique and memorable musical performances throughout the Military and civilian communities. As a Vietnam Veteran, his musical message was enjoyed in times of war and throughout the world.

He was a life member of the Association of Military Musicians, Warrant Officers Association and was a member of the Michigan Masonic Lodge.
