



## Sarah Elizabeth Stoneman

June 13, 1921 - July 26, 2008

Sarah Elizabeth Stoneman, 87, passed away on July 26, 2008 in Indianapolis. Born in North Charleroi, Pennsylvania in 1921, Miss Stoneman moved to Indianapolis in 1946. She graduated from Grove City College in Pennsylvania and was a graduate of Charity School of Nursing in New Orleans, Louisiana. She was Colonel Clarke's stenographer at New Bilibid Prison in the Philippines for the war crime trials of Generals Yamashita and Muto in the months following WWII. She finished her military service stationed at the Pentagon. As a RN she worked at St. Vincent's, Long Hospital, and retired from the VA Hospital in Indianapolis in 1982. Survivors include her sister, Josephine (Ted) Mathews, nieces, Margaret ElBarassi, and Betty Jo Brown, nephews, James and Charles Weddell, and William Stoneman; several great nieces and nephews and many great great nieces and nephews.
