Shellie Mae Boice, 86, of Indianapolis, passed away July 23, 2009. She was born Christmas Day, 1922 in Elba, Ohio to Clarence and Edna (Hughey) Ogle. Shellie was an inspiring teacher, dedicated Minister's wife, missionary and a loving wife, mother and grandmother. Engaged to Glenn Boice the day before Pearl Harbor and married at the end of the war, they enjoyed 64 wonderful years together. Her tenacious spirit, sense of humor and perseverance stayed with her to the end and she will be greatly missed by all who knew her.
