Stephen graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1966 with a Bachelor of Arts degree. He was a member of Phi Alpha Theta National History Honorary Fraternity and AFROTC Cadet Staff. Upon graduation, he became a commissioned officer. He attended Precision Photographic Services Course in 1967, Reconnaissance Staff Officer Course in 1969, Advanced Military Management Schools: Squadron Officer School in 1972 and Air Command and Staff College in 1978. Stephen earned his Master of Science Degree in 1978 from the University of Southern California. He was stationed at numerous Air Force bases in the United States, England and Southeast Asia. When Stephen retired from the Air Force, he worked in several Civil Service positions. He was an accomplished organist and loved to travel and play pipe organs all over Europe and the United States. Stephen was a member of the American Guild of Organists and American Theater Organ Society. He was active in numerous local organizations and an usher at Trinity Episcopal Church. Stephen was a life long Episcopalian.

Stephen is the oldest son of the Reverend John Nelson Brockmann and Marie Louise Brockmann, who preceded him in death.

Stephen is survived by his younger brother, George Brockmann and his wife, Betsy; nieces and nephews, Andrea Brockmann, Christopher Brockmann, Deborah Watts and Kelly Tran.
