Thomas John Sukup, 64, of Shoals, IN, passed away August 7, 2021 in French Lick, IN. He was born in Chicago November 25, 1956 to the late John Peter and Janet Laura (Greger) Sukup. Tom was a 1975 graduate of Lawrence Central High School and attended Ball State University.
