



Ward C. Degler

May 4, 1935 - November 23, 2024

Ward C. Degler,

89, of Zionsville, passed away November 23, 2024. He was born May 4, 1935 in Phillips, WI, to the late Roy H. and Marion B. (Shaw) Degler. Ward graduated in 1953 from Jeff City High School, Jefferson City, MO, receiving a scholarship to the Kansas City Art Institute. He attended 1 ½ years before entering the U.S. Army. Using the GI Bill, he attended the University of Missouri School of Journalism, graduating in 1962. Ward used his writing skills in marketing for corporations and advertising agencies. He was Creative Director for the American Legion the last few years of his career, retiring in February 2001.

Ward started writing a weekly column in the 1990's for the Zionsville Times Sentinel, titled "I Was Just Thinking." In 2011, he published a book of 151 of these columns, "The Dark Ages of My Youth and Times More Recent." He later wrote a weekly column for the Current in Zionsville. Ward's newest book, "The Golden Osprey", is a novel about a Viet Nam Vet who lost his faith in mankind and in God and how he found it again. It is expected to be in circulation by mid-December.

While Ward made a living writing, his first love was art. His greatest love was connecting his art with his faith. He is known for letting the Holy Spirit guide him with his paintings, gifting them to leaders of Cursillo weekends.

During Ward's flight training, he and instructor Kirk Forbes shared Christ together, followed by attending Bible Study Fellowship. They later shared a sailboat in Key West. His faith continued to grow through Cursillo and Holy Family Community. The relationships he built with his brothers in Christ have continued to be an integral part of his daily life until his passing.

Many called Ward the "Renaissance Man" because he excelled in many areas. In addition to his careers, love of art and writing, he also enjoyed playing the guitar and harmonica and singing with family and friends. He loved the outdoors, especially sailing. Ward was an excellent carpenter and could do almost anything. He was witty and a fun storyteller and his smile could light up a room.

Ward married Jeanne Hodge Degler on November 23, 1980. He worshiped at St. Alphonsus Liguori Catholic Church where he was a member of Knights of Columbus Council #12510. He was a member of the American Legion, Cursillo in Christianity, a writer's group, past member of the Rotary Club and on the Board of Directors for Seeds of Hope.

Visitation will be Sunday, December 1, 2024 from 2:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. at Shirley Brothers Fishers-Castleton Chapel, 9900 Allisonville Road, Fishers, and one hour prior to mass. A Mass of Christian Burial will be held Monday, December 2, 2024 at 11:00 a.m. at St. Alphonsus Liguori Catholic Church, 1870 West Oak Street, Zionsville.

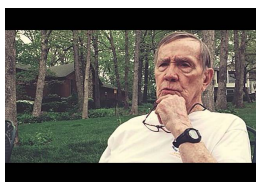

What do you say when you lose a best friend? Who you loved for decades and played a major role in your life.

When Ward decided to learn to fly, I got my flight instructor certification renewed just to help him get his pilot's license. What I didn't expect was that during this training we would share Christ with each other and that would change our lives and draw us closer.

We both were sailors and sailed together in the Bahamas, rebuilt a sailboat in Key West and sailed to the Dry Tortugas. Sailing became an important part of our friendship.

Ward and I spent several years attending Bible Study Fellowship, a nationwide in-depth bible study program. We sang together, prayed together and studied together. This led us to regular luncheons and breakfasts that would continue for years.

He lent his artistic and writing talents to me when I wrote my book, Love Kristen. He drew the front cover and spent days helping me write and edit the final copy. Most of all, he was there to support me when I relived the loss of my daughter while writing the book. He was a valued advisor to the board of my Kristen Forbes EVE Foundation.

When I was going through a couple of major crises in my life, Ward was always there for me. He was always willing to offer encouragement. He was more than a friend, he was my brother in Christ and a source of laughter and wisdom. His smile, quick wit and kind heart made him a best friend and he has left me with a life full of wonderful memories and experiences.

Like Kristen, I know Ward stands at Heaven's Gate awaiting my arrival.
