“ Bill was a highly valued RR employee and an important colleague to me. I originally worked with Bill 20 years ago when I was just a kid in the A-Building and he would give me rides on his buggy to look for parts, the “hot” ones on the list on his cruddy old clipboard. When Bill came to procurement, he was the “boots on the ground” guy to go into suppliers to fix big problems. He knew his way around any shop floor, he knew how to manufacture Defence parts, and he knew production control like the back of his hand. Countless times over the years people would call out for Bill to go to a supplier to solve the latest crisis, and I would have to remind people that he could only be in one place at a time. His name was known at every level of the Defence business, and everyone who knew him held him in high regard. One of the fastest ways to diffuse emotion on a critical item was to say “Bill’s onsite”. Once people heard it, they knew the problem had our best on it.

Suppliers also would call on Bill for help (“Christi, can Bill come out here next week? We’ve been having this issue and the last time he was here he helped fix it.”). Every new supplier I notified that we were sending Bill to would push back and tell me they didn’t need RR’s help and they didn’t need someone there slowing them down. Bill would turn up to a supplier, be put in a conference room all day and given the cold shoulder treatment. Two weeks later he would have free access to their shop floor, they would be coming to him for help, and the next thing I knew he would have a job offer from them (at least three times!!). Bill would tease me to tell me he had another job offer, but I knew he would never leave. Bill’s blood ran blue and his loyalty to RR was unmatched. He loved being a road warrior, he loved solving problems, he loved working with people, and he loved Rolls-Royce. I hope he knew how much RR loved him back.

Bill, I will miss you greatly. I don’t know what I’m going to do the next time I have a problem that I need you to help me fix (probably tomorrow). Rest in peace my friend.
