William C. Schubert,

92, a founding partner of CSO Architects of Indianapolis, passed away February 27, 2016 from a brief illness. He was born May 31, 1923 as the youngest of three children to William and Henrietta Schubert, immigrants of Germany.

Bill graduated from Tech High School and served during WW II in the Army Air Corps, Intelligence. He married Ina M. Allbaugh, and obtained a degree in Architecture from the University of Illinois. Bill co-founded CSO Architects with Harry Cooler and Les Olds in 1961. His firm grew to be one of Indiana's largest and most reputable design firms for civic, corporate, educational, hotel/hospitality, health and research facilities. Bill retired in 1986, and happily resided with Ina for 20 years in Ft. Myers Beach, FL. He was a man of integrity, honesty, and compassion, and well-respected by his peers. Bill was a true example of a loving husband and father/mentor to many.

Bill is survived by his loving wife of 69 years, Ina; his daughters, Julie Schubert and Becky Augustin (Drew); grandchildren, Bryan Augustin, Brooke Sipe and Will Shippee; and great-grandchildren, Isabel, Briella and Alexandra. A Celebration of Life Gathering will be held at a later date for family members and friends.
