Zane D. Koester, 71, of Indianapolis, passed away December 31, 2020. He was born July 3, 1949 in Lakeview, Oregon to the late Elmer William and Teodora (Ferol) Koester Ryan. Zane was a 1967 graduate of Greensburg High School and played on the semistate basketball team. He received his Bachelor's Degree in Business from Indiana University. He proudly served his country in the U.S. Army Special Forces for over 30 years and was a member of the U.S. Army Special Forces Association. Zane married Sheree DeWester, November 5, 1983 and was employed as a letter carrier for the USPS for over 30 years. Zane is survived by his wife, Sheree Koester; children, Daniele R. 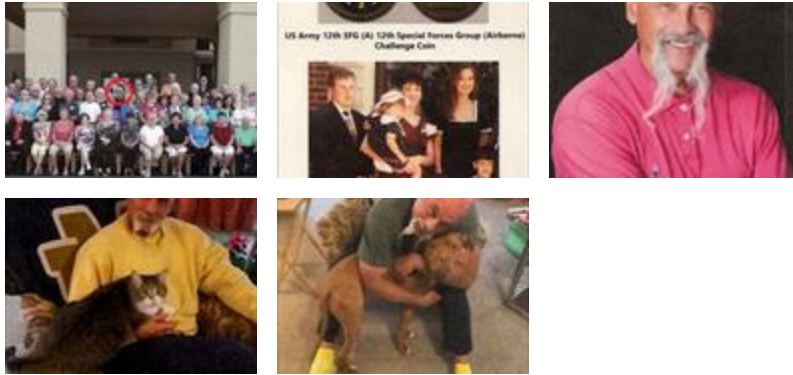

For some unknown reason Zane took a liking to me. I never understood why, as I was totally unprepared for his intellect. But boy, did we have some conversations. Well, not really conversations, -lively gives and takes! And Zane could give it. He could talk about any subject—he had been around the block a few times. Zane knew the facts and was always certain of his stance on things. And Zane could take it too. Anyone who knew Zane, knew he was the definition of stubborn, but, if on that rare occasion I made a point he hadn't thought of, he would relent. Zane was one of the few men I have met that I never felt anxious to open- up with in conversation—I always felt free and alive when talking with Zane. On those occasion when Zane would appear out of nowhere, he would equally ride off into the sunset, never knowing when he might reappear or call again—he was kinda like the lone ranger in that regard.
